# Overview

The Republic of Kenya is located in Eastern Africa, and is home to approximately 54 million people.

Kenya has the largest and most advanced economy in East and Central Africa, and continues to grow, attracting economic migrants from across Africa, and hosting refugees from 16 nations, including Rwanda, Somalia, and Sudan, as well as internally displaced Kenyans.

Since 1991, Kakuma has hosted a large refugee camp near Kakuma town, in northwestern Kenya. Kakuma Refugee Camp is managed by the Kenyan government, in collaboration with the UNHCR. Most of these refugees are women, young girls, and orphaned children facing cultural challenges, economic hardships, and a lack of training opportunities. These imbalances leave them vulnerable to abuse, forced marriages, and cyclical poverty.

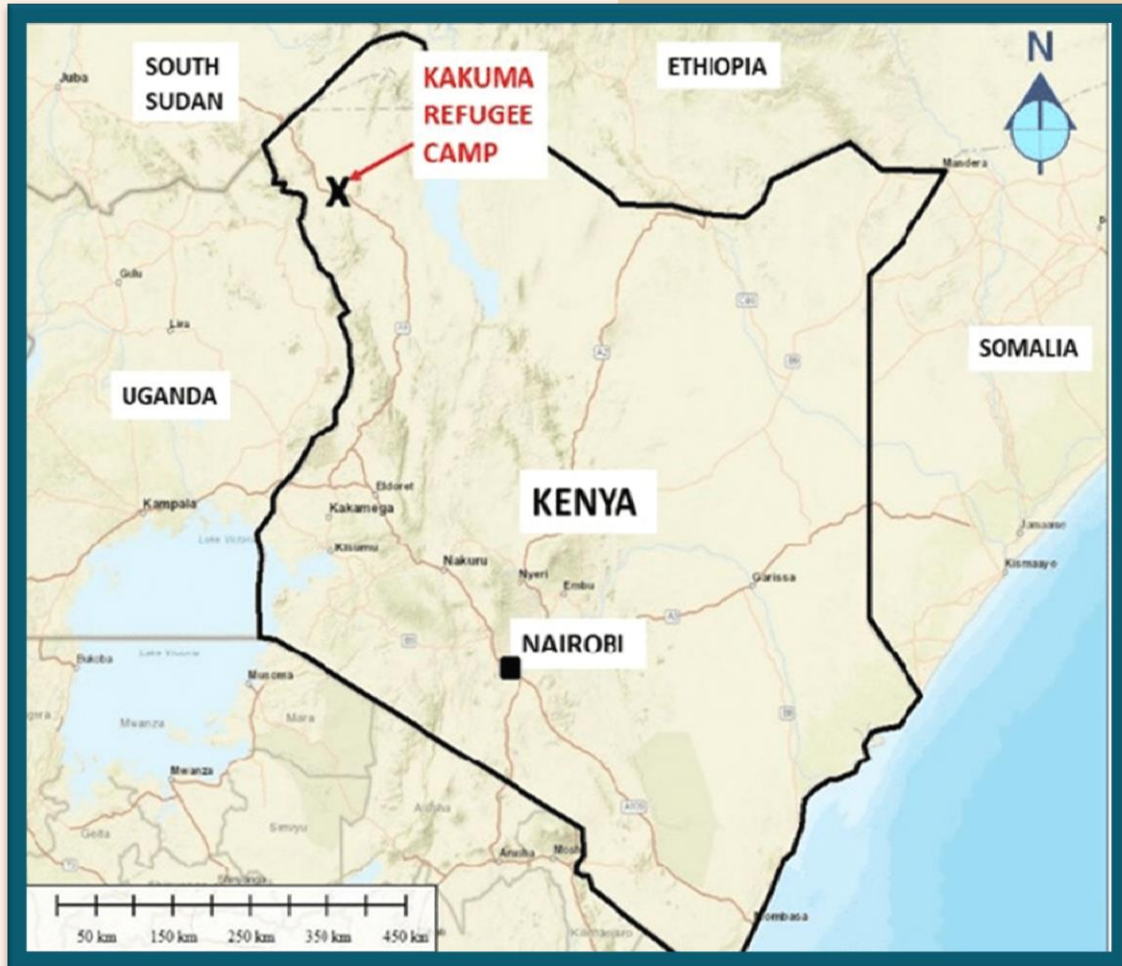
The **Women's Power Center** is a national civil society, dedicated to supporting disadvantaged women in refugee camps across Kenya. It currently serves approximately 450 women through literacy, bakery and pastries, and table banking outreach programs.

**WPC** mobilizes community support, and collaborates with government agencies, NGOs, and financial institutions to develop sustainable economic opportunities for women and their families.

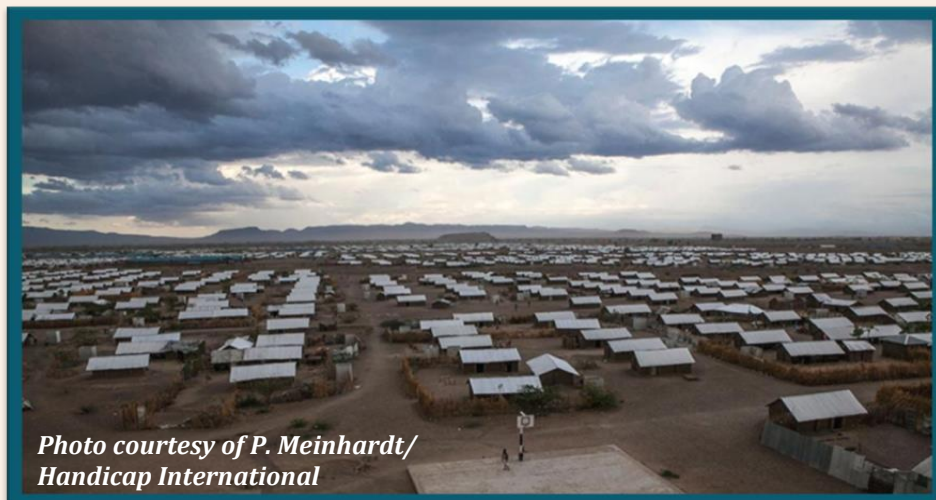
**WPC** sustains its programs through benefit events, grants, and ongoing partnerships, ensuring the longevity and scalability of its efforts.

# Project Snapshot

**Global Humanitarian Mission** as a Christian organization, is dedicated to encouraging and building up others, as mandated by scripture.

**GHM** is establishing *Permaculture For Kakuma* that will support young refugee women who have either had no formal education, or who have had to drop out of school at an early age.

This 3-month quarterly program is aimed at teaching young women sustainable farming methods and agricultural skills for growing vegetables. This will not only lead to self-reliance and an independent future, but improve their nutrition.

The project will supply the following:

- 3 kg. (6 lbs.) Kale seeds
- 2 kg. (4 lbs.) Cow peas seeds
- 2 kg. (4 lbs.) Onions
- 10 Hoes
- 10 Watering cans
- 5 Rakes
- 4 Wheelbarrows
- 1 2,000-liter (528 gal.) Water tank
- 1 Facilitator
- 2 Babysitters
- 2 Security personnel

*This project aims to empower 30-50 refugee girls and women between 15 and 25.*

**TOTAL COST: \$1,579.85**
