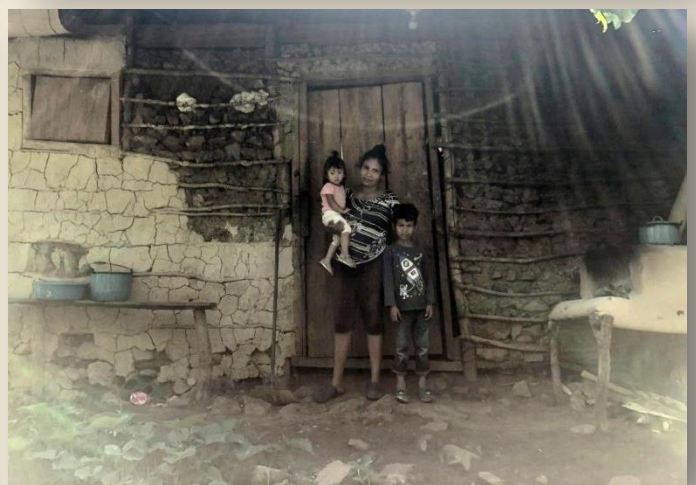

PROJECT PROPOSAL *Change for 100 Families*



HONDURAS, CENTRAL AMERICA

Overview

Bordering Guatemala, El Salvador and Nicaragua, Honduras is one of the poorest Spanish-speaking countries in the Western Hemisphere. Nearly 65% of Honduras' population of approximately 9 million people live in poverty.

The poverty index continues to increase every year, according to INE, reaching 74 percent on average in 2022, and 79 percent in rural areas. The country has not been able to recover from the COVID-19 pandemic, followed by hurricanes Eta and Iota in 2020.

Honduras has the highest income inequality of all of Latin America. Almost 49 percent of the Honduran population lives below the poverty line, existing on less than \$2 per day. Most families can only afford to eat twice a day.

While some families live in dignified concrete homes, the poor are barely able to feed their families, and live in constant fear that their fragile homes will not survive another storm and collapse. For their houses are made of mud and sticks and salvaged materials. The dirt floors (bajareque) turn to mud in wet weather, and they are threatened with Chagas disease – and likely heart failure – from the disease-carrying mosquito.

Local non-profit organization, CEPUDO, collaborates with international organizations to work with communities in Honduras, assisting families to overcome conditions of extreme poverty. CEPUDO has been instrumental in establishing fully developed communities, strengthening a spirit of solidarity and self-sustainability through donated material goods, development of productive projects, training and technical assistance.

Project Snapshot

Global Humanitarian Mission is heeding the urgent call from CEPUDO, and seeks your partnership in improving the lives of desperately poor families in Honduras.

CEPUDO has identified 100 families living in extremely precarious conditions in the rural areas of Colón, Comayagua, Intibucá, Olancho and Santa Barbara, Honduras.

Through its housing program, CEPUDO proposes the establishment of a community with a sewage treatment system, running water supply network, community center, school and kindergarten, and health center.

Change For 100 Families is being proposed to help provide a decent home for families in need. Land has been donated by the local municipalities, and each of these families has legal documents proving their ownership of a lot.

The project consists of the following:

- Construction of **100** 2-bedroom concrete homes, with
 - Electricity
 - Plumbing and sanitation (flushable toilet), including piping and fixtures
 - Water
 - Healthy kitchen (1 Eco stove & a water purification pitcher)
 - Finishing and painting
- Furniture (1 double bed, 2 single beds with cotton sheets, plastic table and 4 chairs, 1 electric fan)
- Monitoring & evaluation by **GHM**
- Sign

The completion date of this initiative may be extended for issues related to weather, natural disaster or civil unrest, to the extent that such events exceed normal conditions and impede the project's progress.

TOTAL COST: \$1,179,852
