Overview

Guatemala in Central America was ruled for many years by military regimes, during which 200,000 people lost their lives. The country is now ruled by a civilian government; however, crime and violence are still widespread. Approximately half of the Guatemalan population lives in poverty and 13.7% of them live in extreme poverty.

Esquipulas, a small market town on the southeastern Guatemala border, is known for its coffee cultivation. The first settlers in this town were descendants from the indigenous Mayan people. Today, Esquipulas has a population is over 18,000.

For many years, children in rural schools in Guatemala have struggled to learn to read and write, largely due to a serious lack of resources. Infrastructure like chairs, desks, child-sized tables, and bookshelves are deteriorated from overuse, and the general environment is not inviting or stimulating. Many teachers are not trained, and specifically, have not learned strategies for teaching reading. In students' homes, where most families live below the poverty line, few children have access to children's books.

These challenges have only been exacerbated by the pandemic-era school closures, which lasted over two years. Reading assessments conducted in 2023 determined that third and fourth graders had average reading skills of the first grade level. Additionally, first graders who participated in the assessment, read an average of 19 words per minute, under the required standard of 40 words per minute.

Fabretto Children's Foundation is a non-profit organization which works with local community organizations to educate and empower underserved children, youth, and their families in vulnerable communities.

Fabretto is focusing attention on **Olopita School**, a nursery and primary school, with a student population of 61, served by a staff of 5 teachers. The school is located in the central part of the municipality, approximately a 20-minute walk for most of the students who attend from the surrounding 8 hamlets.

- Teacher training
- Ongoing technical assistance and monitoring
