# Overview

Abia State in the southeast zone of Nigeria, is fairly new, having been established in 1991. It is home to over 4 million people, 95% of whom are from the Ngwa indigenous clan of Igbo.

The city of Aba is known as a major commercial and industrial hub in Nigeria, renowned for its vibrant small-scale and informal manufacturing industries, including textiles, garments, shoes, leatherworks, and metal fabrication. However, most of the residents are engaged in agriculture, cultivating staple crops such as yams, rice, cassava. Oil palm is the main cash crop.

Decayed structures and a deteriorated socioeconomic infrastructure are telltale signs of a rising poverty rate, unemployment, urban deterioration, and crime in Aba.

Thanks to the overwhelming support of donors partnering with **Global Humanitarian Mission**, the work of Marian Missionaries Ad Reginum Dei is being solidified in the massive new 3-story seminary and chapel constructed in the heart of Aba.

Here at the **Donum Josephinum Seminary**, the guidelines of priestly formation mandated by the Catholic Bishops Conference of Nigeria, will be diligently observed. Here, **50** Seminarians, Formators and Novices, who have a deeply rooted love for Jesus, will be groomed as servant leaders to expand the mission of the Church by serving the poor.

It is also the goal of the Missionaries to help empower local young teens, through the vocational school on campus.





In addition to learning invaluable life skills, and the love of God and His Word, a vocational training program will equip young people who are undereducated and have no resources, for an independent and successful future.

*Floor plans of the proposed 2-story Jesus Embrace Vocational Institute*





# From Global Humanitarian Mission
