# Overview

Ayakomaso is a farming community of the capital city of Sunyani, located in the west Bono region.

It is home to about 15,000 residents, who support themselves as traders and farmers. Millet, yam, cashew, cassava, beans, corn, and rice are some of the crops cultivated in these parts.

The socio-economic conditions in these parts are insurmountable, and the Daughters of Mary Mother of Mercy (DMMM) Congregation, otherwise known as “**Mercy Sisters**,” whose Charism is to bear witness to the Mercy of God, expressed through *Compassion, Forgiveness* and *Kindness*, is moved to do something about the plight of the people here.

The **Mercy Sisters** are animated as God’s instruments in giving hope and a purposeful life to the poor, and have embarked on a massive campaign to improve general living standards in this region. One of the most dire plights they have set out to address, is the scourge of abandoned children left like waste on Ghana’s streets. And the Catholic Diocese of Sunyani responsible for this Congregation, has heeded their call for help. Already, they have awarded land in the adjoining community of Nsapor for the purpose of building a stable home for these unfortunate children. Thanks to the overwhelming support of donors, ground has been broken and work has begun to complete this project, so that by Fall, **140** boys and girls will begin their road to a bright future.

With that underway, the Sisters are recognizing the overwhelming need for a clinic to serve the people in this area. So great is the need, that local medical staff have to wade through surging river and mountainous terrain to reach the homebound with medical care. Fr. Peter Claver Sutinga also extends his reach way beyond the adjoining Parish of St. Anthony’s, and Director of St. Peter’s Catholic School, to pastoral care for hundreds of families in the surrounding villages.

When necessary, Fr. Peter is called upon to be the ambulance that transports women in labor to the hospital, as well as those patients in need of hospitalization. All in his personal vehicle.

# Project Snapshot

**Global Humanitarian Mission**, as a Christian organization, enacts the Corporal Works of Mercy to those we serve. As such, we are in support of partnering with the Mercy Sisters to bring lifesaving medical care to the needy in Ghana.

The **Mary Mother Of Mercy PolyClinic** project is being established within the guidelines of the local Municipality to ensure that vulnerable families in this region will benefit from the most comprehensive healthcare services, where previously they did not have this opportunity.

The proposed Polyclinic will be within a 5-mile range of the town where most of its patients will attend by foot, while others will drive their cars or motorcycles. Services will not be free, as patients do have insurance, which is subsidized by the Government. Few do not; however, they will not be turned away.

Patients will be treated by qualified professional staff who are on salary with CHAG (Christian Health Association), a recognized agency of the Ministry of Health.



The project also includes a borehole to be drilled on one end of the property, that will provide much-needed water for the clinic and entire community as well as three neighboring villages.

The 29,000 sq. ft. PolyClinic will provide the following services:

- Outpatient Department with 140 seating capacity
  - 70-bed wards, each with Nurses' Station
  - Emergency Department, includes 6-bed capacity
    - Males – 16
    - Females – 22
    - Children – 15
  - Maternity unit, 11-bed capacity, including
    - Delivery room
    - Sluice
    - Observation room
    - Post maternity room
    - Ante- and Post-natal care units
    - (the majority of women do not receive medical attention throughout their entire pregnancy)*
  - Nurses' room
  - Midwife office with 2-toilet bathroom
  - Each ward includes 2-toilet, 2-shower restrooms
  - Totaling 7 bathrooms, 39 toilets and sinks
- Surgical unit
  - Injection/vaccination room
  - Eye care unit, including
    - Consulting room
    - Examination room
    - Treatment, sluice rooms
    - Optical services
  - Public Health Center
  - Pharmacy
  - 2-room laboratory
  - Matron's office
  - Records & Accounting Dept.
  - Conference hall
  - Staff dining room
  - Laundry room
  - Equipment/surgical store
  - Storage room
