Salvador Corleto School Expansion



Las Sandias, Santa Rosa de Copán
HONDURAS

Overview

Earlier this year, professional athlete, Alex Austin, founder of non-profit **Altitude Performance**, which empowers underprivileged youth through holistic and athletic development, and collegiate preparation, hosted a sports camp in the rural village of Las Sandías, Honduras.

Las Sandías has a population of approximately 890 people, with more than half under the age of 18. Most families rely on subsistence farming, and access to resources such as education and healthcare is limited.

While delivering shoes and soccer balls at the sports camp he held, Alex saw firsthand the challenges local children face at the school, and felt moved to do something about it.

The school was built approximately 20 years ago, and consists of three buildings, a kindergarten, elementary (grades 1-6), and high school (grades 7-9), taught by a staff of 6 teachers.

The student population has increased significantly over the years, and the school is now faced with severe overcrowding. In addition, the facilities are severely deteriorated, due to a lack of funds for regular maintenance.

Many classrooms have cracked walls, and damaged windows and doors with broken locks, which compromise both the safety and overall functionality of the school. The electrical system is faulty, with limited lighting due to a lack of working fixtures. The restroom facilities are largely non-functional, posing a hygiene risk for the students. There is only one hand-washing sink on campus, and it is in poor condition, making it difficult for the children to maintain proper hygiene.

Most critically, the school does not have sufficient classrooms to serve the student population. This shortage of space makes it difficult to organize students effectively, and limits the quality of their educational experience.

Project Snapshot

Global Humanitarian Mission understands the plight of Salvador Corleto School, and seeks your partnership in enhancing the educational experience for boys and girls at this remote school in Las Sandías, Honduras.

The **Salvador Corleto School Expansion** project is being established to provide a safe and comfortable learning environment that effectively meet the demands of an increasing student population.

The project will entail the following:

- Construction of a 3-classroom building with Aluzinc roof
- Electrical installations and interior lighting
- 6 gender-specific bathrooms, including
 - Ceramic tile walls and floor
 - Plumbing and sanitation systems
 - Fixtures
- Hand-washing station
- Stairway to the annexed primary school bathroom

150 students will benefit from this school expansion with a wholesome educational environment.

TOTAL COST: \$106,517.90



The current bathroom facilities


3-Classroom building with bathroom




Build Them A Stairway
